## *From The Pastor's Desk*

*Dear Parishioners and Friends,*

"Educating the mind without educating the heart is no education at all."  
Aristotle

If we do not bring our children to Sunday school on a regular basis, they will not learn about Orthodox Christianity, and they will drift away from the Church when they become adults. It is really that simple. It is the job of the church community to educate the mind, heart and soul of its parishioners; however, this can only be accomplished if the people put forth the effort to actually attend.

Unfortunately, we live in a society which has little education when it comes to

religion. I often hear the phrase, "I'm not religious, but I'm spiritual", a completely meaningless statement, which simply stems from a lack of knowledge concerning religion. Not only do we as a society not understand religion in general, we don't even understand our own religion. This, of course, needs to change.

Here at St. John's, we have a good grounding for religious education. We have a dedicated Sunday school director and a dedicated group of teachers to lead our Sunday school program; however, the success of the program is tied directly to the regular attendance of the children. One major issue that has come up is that on any



given Sunday, there is sometimes one child to two teachers in a classroom. As parents, we cannot afford to neglect our children's religious education.

## *In Memory of Fr. Spero Page 1929-2014: a simple priest reflects upon one of his parish's most beloved predecessors.*

I did not know Fr. Spero Page. I first heard of him when I came to St. John's in 2001. I heard of him again when I returned last year. As a priest of almost a quarter of a century, I have followed several priests in the parishes I have served.

Typically, the new priest – after first arriving – hears about the priest or priests that preceded him. It is almost always a mixture of good things and not so good things; even the best priests have their detractors. Oddly, neither

the first time I was here nor this time, have I heard one negative thing about Fr. Spero here at St. John's. He served for a lengthy time, from 1963 to 1976 (the year I graduated from high school!).

It is, of course, a sacrifice to make the effort, to take the time to drive a long way on Sunday mornings, but this is the cost of discipleship. And it does cost something to be an active, committed Christian.

Beyond Sunday school, our director, Steve Coraluzzi, has done a fantastic job of planning out Sunday

school events (The Aquarium, Ice Skating, End of the Year Party at Dave and Buster's, etc...), and these social events help bring the community together.

For adults, I taught a fall class last year on important issues facing the Orthodox Church. I will teach another class in the fall this year. This continuing education is important for all of us to

learn more about the issues of our faith at a very practical level.

As the school year comes upon us, we should all consider what we have, the beauty and uniqueness of St. John's, and make the effort to participate in all aspects of church life so that we can continue to grow in faith and in community.

### *In Memory of Fr. Spero, Continued*

Thirteen years is a long time to hear only positive things about himself and his priesthood, which shows that he was very much loved by this community.



The priesthood is not an easy vocation. The priest must deal with parishioners from all walks of life, from all political and social perspectives, from all different ideas about what the church is and what a priest should be like. He has to love all of his parishioners equally, and he must walk the line between leading on the one hand and serving on the other. It can be tricky business, and yet Fr. Spero seemed to be able to do all of this. From everything I have heard, he was a very loving human being and a priest with a great sense of humor. He loved the

Church and his ministry. He loved, especially, working with the children, as he knew that the young people were not only part of the parish, they were and are the future of the parish.

Fr. Spero fell asleep in the lord on 3 July of this year (he was 84). I could include the facts in his obituary; however, my purpose here is a reflection, a chance to simply pay tribute to someone in my vocation who I did not know personally but whom I admire. Priests like Fr. Spero encourage me, inspire me, help me to remember - in difficult times - that there are men who went before me who truly showed what the Christian life was all about, priests who showed compassion through the

good times and the bad times.

Fr. Spero will not be missed; he will not be missed because the life of St. John's breathes in the creative air he left behind. He will forever be a part of this parish, with stories passed down to the younger people who never knew him. I am not trying to make a saint out of him. What I am trying to do is pay tribute to someone in my vocation who I look up to, someone who will always be loved in this community.

I'm glad I didn't have to follow him immediately. Those would have been very big shoes to fill!

*Home Blessings*

It is traditional in the Orthodox Church for the priest to go to each household of his parishioners and bless their homes. This takes place, typically, after the Feast of Theophany, but can be celebrated at any time of the year. The blessing of the homes, of course, is more than a quaint tradition; it is an opportunity for the priest to visit and pray with the individuals, couples, and families in their own homes.

In the early days, priests could actually do this by walking to the homes in the village or town. Now, it is a somewhat daunting task, especially for St. John's in Philadelphia because we are so spread out. Be patient. I will get to everyone. You will be contacted by e-mail or phone as to when I will be in your area. If you are not available during that time, I will make special arrangements to come at another time. It is, after

all, an important time for the priest and Parishioners.

I look forward to visiting and praying with all of you in the weeks ahead.

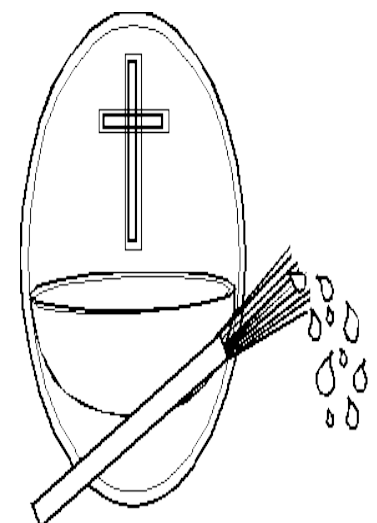

## *Parish Ministry Teams*

As most of you know, we are organizing a whole slate of groups in order to set up a more active parish that everyone can get involved in. This month, I am focusing on four different ministries: Education, Young Adult League (YAL), Outreach, and Charity and Benevolence.

**YAL** - On Wednesday, 10 September, I will be meeting with a committee of young adults to organize regular meetings, a bible study, and social events. We will decide what works best for the young adults at St. John's and will plan out a calendar. YAL will consist of people who are single, married, married with children and any of their friends who would like to participate.

**Education** - On Saturday, 13 September, Steve Coraluzzi and I will be holding a Sunday school teacher workshop and appreciation lunch. The idea behind the workshop is get our Sunday school program better prepared and work on various issues that need to be addressed in order to make our program work well for our children. Later we will be addressing adult education: the classes taught in the fall, retreats at the parish with a guest speaker, and possibly a week-end retreat to a near-by monastery.

**Outreach** - Tuesday, 16 September, I will meet with the Outreach Committee. This group will participate in the best ways to reach out to visitors at St. John's, to people who are sick or in the hospital, to shut-ins, and to anyone else who needs a visitation, a phone call, a card, etc.

**Charity and Benevolence** - On Tuesday, 23 September, I will meet with this group to discuss ways in which we can effectively reach out to groups in need of assistance. This could include the homeless in our area, Orthodox mission parishes who are struggling to get started, Monasteries that might need our help, community projects that we can get involved with as a parish, and other situations that come up from time to time.

There will be more ministries organized, but for now, all parishioners are welcomed - and encouraged - to participate in any of these groups. We will have a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board or you can contact me by phone or e-mail if you are interested. Let's all get involved to make St. John's a light to the Gospel here in Center City.

### Monthly Giving Items:

As many of you know we have a "Monthly Giving" offering. That is we ask our parishioners to donate different items each month. 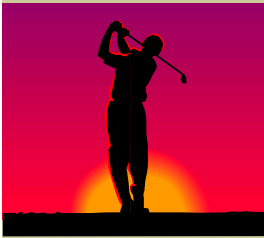
Through the years Charlie Biando and his jazz quartet have enter-

We have over 200 families listed as active parishioners. Yet, we have received pledges from 101 families.

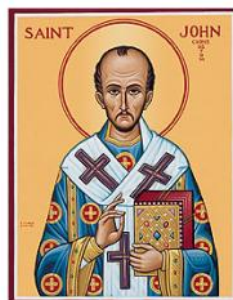
If the remainder of our active parishioners submit a pledge we will far exceed our goal.
