From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

T.S. Eliot, in his great poem "The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock," writes, "Do I dare, do I dare disturb the universe?" It is, for those of us who are baptized, an interesting question. We are not called upon to stand at the corner and shout out pages from the Bible. We are, however, called upon to proclaim the Gospel in the way we live, to be an example for what we believe.

Jesus did not "hang out" with the religious people of his time; he milled around with the blue collar workers, with fishermen, those in the tavern, even with prostitutes. He was there to meet with them, get to know them, help them change.

He showed, by example, what God was like. When called upon, he spoke; and he disturbed the universe by what he said, much to the dismay of the religious leaders.

We are, by our baptism, called upon to disturb the universe as Jesus did; we are called upon to be authentic. God made each of us as unique, unrepeatably human beings, and trying to be someone else simply doesn't fall into God's plan.

As we approach Great Lent, our most holy time of the year, each of us needs to reflect on what it means to be authentically who we are, to use the gifts God gave us in order to reach out to others.

how much technology we wanted to use. One thing is for certain: we were way behind our peer parishes.

In August 2012, Parish Council approved an initiative to search for a website provider that would be easy to manage, informative to our parishioners and friends, yet reasonable from a cost perspective. We took a closer look at Eastern Orthodox web sites and learned that some were magnificent with rich content, and others were nicely tailored to better suit our needs.

In November 2012, Parish Council selected Orthodox Web Solutions (OWS) as our new service provider. OWS provides web design and hosting for hundreds of religious organizations around the globe. We were very impressed by the over 300 active sites it manages, and the cost of the service fit comfortably into our yearly budget.

OWS also supports another website, orthodoxynamerica.org, which uses mapping software to show where all the Orthodox churches in the United States, Canada, and Mexico are located, and is linked to Google to provide driving directions and satellite imagery. We at Saint John's already have this link on our own site




I look forward to visiting

Forgiveness Sunday

Each year, Great Lent begins with Forgiveness Sunday, which is also Cheesefare Sunday (2 March, this year).

Traditionally, in the Orthodox Church, the Rite of Forgiveness is celebrated at Vespers; however, in many churches this rite is done immediately after the Divine Liturgy on that Sunday morning. This is when we will celebrate Forgiveness Sunday. The rite entails forming a line

around the inside of the church and each person present going up to the others and asking forgiveness. Sin reverberates, so even if we don't know the person, we still ask forgiveness for any harm or hurt we have caused. It is a very healing rite, a very loving process.

In addition, it is also Cheesefare Sunday.

Traditionally, all of the meat was eaten up the week before (Meatfare

Sunday), and on Cheesefare all of the dairy products were eaten up. At St. John's, we are celebrating this tradition by having a luncheon after the Divine Liturgy, and asking all of you to bring a meatless dish to share. It is a wonderful way to celebrate this tradition.
